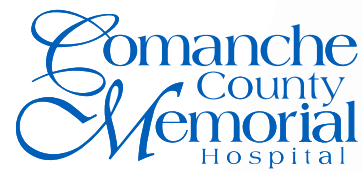

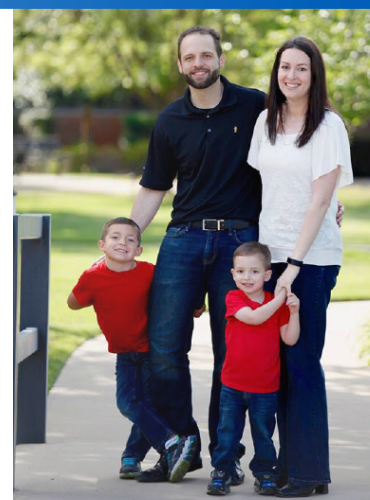
Since 1951, CCMH has provided services to Southwest Oklahoma with a commitment to healthcare leadership and excellence. The hospital is licensed for 265 beds. CCMH is the first and only to provide robotic surgery with the new Da Vinci Xi Surgical System and also the only hospital in the region offering the Mako robotic arm-assisted joint replacement system for total hip, total and partial knee replacement. CCMH is the only comprehensive heart program in Southwest Oklahoma and has provided heart services for over 25 years, including advanced cardiovascular surgery and is designated as an Advanced Primary Stroke Center. CCMH is proud to have the area's first and only Neonatal Intensive Care Unit. Our McMahon Tomlinson Nursing and Rehabilitation Center provides long-term residential care and a skilled nursing unit with 146 beds. Cancer Centers of Southwest Oklahoma provides cancer care in Lawton, Altus, Chickasha and Duncan. CCMH provides virtually any service that could be needed by over 150 providers in the Memorial Medical Group and Lawton Community Health Centers. Convenient locations across Southwest Oklahoma allows you and your family to stay close to home for your advanced medical care.
